Diana Redwood is a Senior Epidemiologist at the Alaska Native Epidemiology Center, Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium (ANTHC). Dr. Redwood has worked in the Alaska Tribal Health System since 2004. Her expertise is in public health and epidemiology, with a focus on cancer screening and prevention. She is the director of a Centers for Disease Control and Prevention-funded ANTHC Colorectal Cancer Control Program (2020-2025). This program works to increase colorectal cancer screening among Alaska Native and American Indian people through public outreach, provider education, and policy and systems level improvements in the Alaska Tribal Health System. She also conducts research into novel methods of colorectal cancer screening outreach and new screening methods for the Alaska Native population.
